

Snow Plowing a TrueGrid Surface

As long as your TrueGrid surface is installed correctly, there should be no issues when plowing snow off of your TrueGrid parking lot or driveway. TrueGrid type grid paving systems have been used in Europe for well over 40 years and in the most snowy of conditions.

Just as you would with a concrete or asphalt parking lot or driveway, simply raise the plow up approximately 2" and you are ready to plow. Raising the plow slightly will keep the plow from catching a corner of the grid and possibly damaging a section of your TrueGrid surface. If you do accidentally damage a section, a TrueGrid surface can easily and inexpensively be repaired.



TrueGrid's porous system will thaw faster than concrete and asphalt, because it allows melted water to flow through directly to the ground surface. This increases the temperature inside of the TrueGrid surface and thus the ice and snow dissipate quicker.

TrueGrid is made of recycled high density polyethylene (HDPE) with UV inhibitors. It will withstand repeat sub-zero temperatures and freeze/thaw cycles without breaking.
